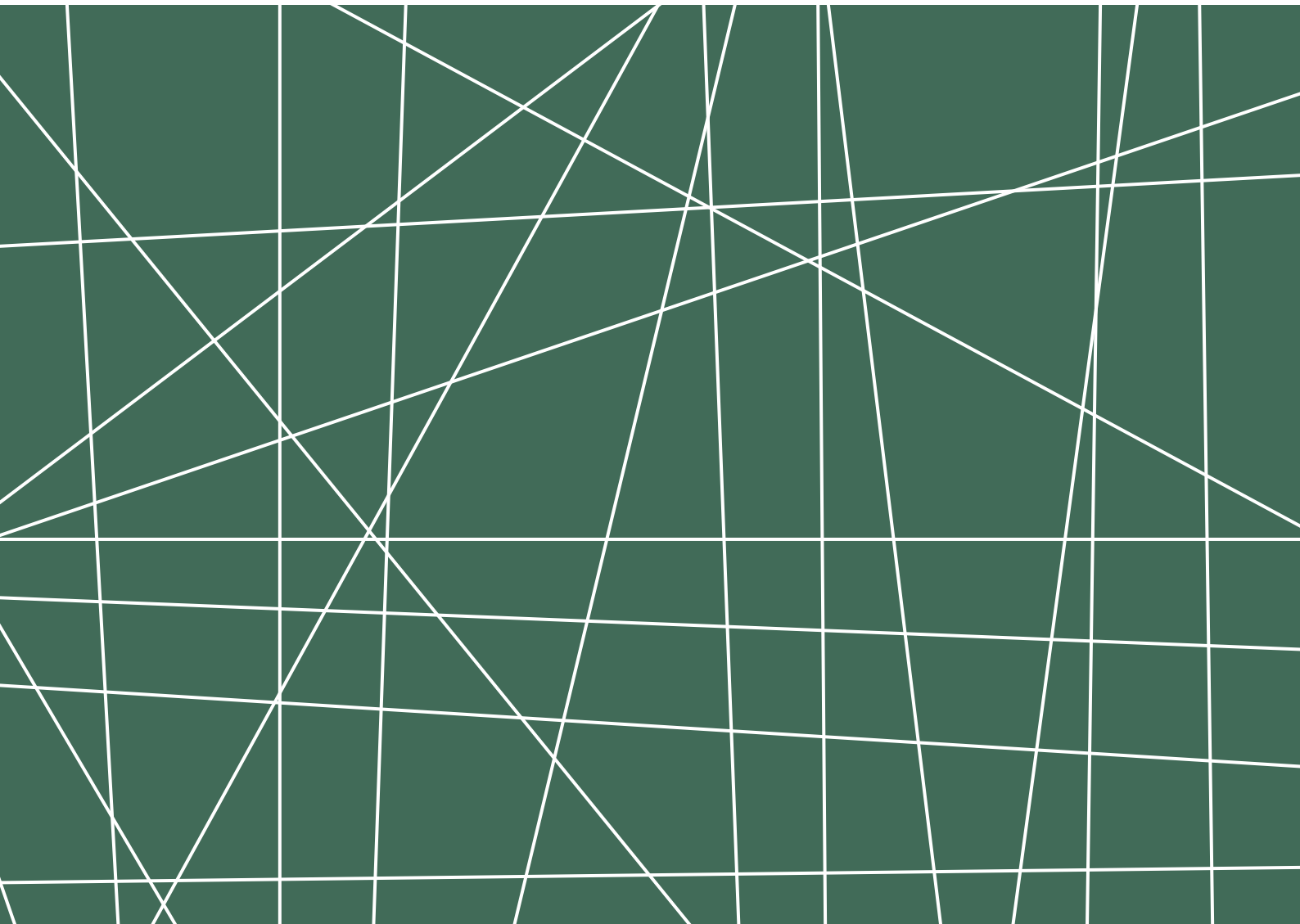

A Word from the Director

Dear readers,

A lot has happened. It's only been a year, but the world has changed so much again. Sadly, much has gone wrong, much has been provoked or neglected. The world has become a more dangerous place. Europe is under serious threat. So, what is the task of the Memory of Nations in this ever-changing world?

I am writing this editorial shortly after US President Trump and Vice President Vance have, quite unnecessarily, escalated negotiations with President Zelensky of Ukraine. I pray for the United States to stand firmly behind Ukraine and for President Trump to negotiate not only a ceasefire, but most importantly, security guarantees for the future. Ukraine must remain a free, self-governing and sovereign country on its internationally recognised territories, even though Russia will likely continue to occupy part of it. Europe should now unite, federalise, and form a pact of countries that are willing and able to defend its freedom. The Czech Republic must be one of those countries.

Stories of the 20th century that recount great struggles for freedom must not only narrate the dramas of the last century, but also encourage the current generation to take responsibility for their country.

Our help to Ukraine continues. Right now, people shocked by Trump's behaviour are sending money for surveillance drones, and over the past few days, we have received almost four million CZK to help Ukraine. Sincere thanks! We will be traveling to Ukraine in a few weeks to hand over drones, plus fifteen off-road vehicles for field hospitals.

As of early March 2025, we are working to complete a major project for the Memory of

Nations collection to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the end of the Second World War titled, Let's Not Forget 80. It is supported by a campaign whose motto is: "We thought it was long over...". Many thanks to all our partners, especially the PPF Foundation.

We are also preparing educational teaching sets: multimedia methodological packages aimed at helping primary and secondary school teachers share essential knowledge about freedom, active citizenship and conscription against the backdrop of authentic stories of the 20th century.

In cooperation with the Benetheo Foundation and teachers, we have drawn from our educational programmes, be it methodological packages, Stories of Our Neighbours, workshops or cinema stories, to create a new methodological project, "PN Textbook". It will not only be an online tool to bring 20th century stories into the classroom, but we are also looking to connect teachers in the vast network of Memory of Nations to share their experiences.

I would like to thank our excellent Memory of Nations team! My colleagues are extremely smart, hard-working, and passionate.

And from the bottom of my heart, I thank you, all of our supporters, donors, and partners. Don't let us down, we cannot do without your support.

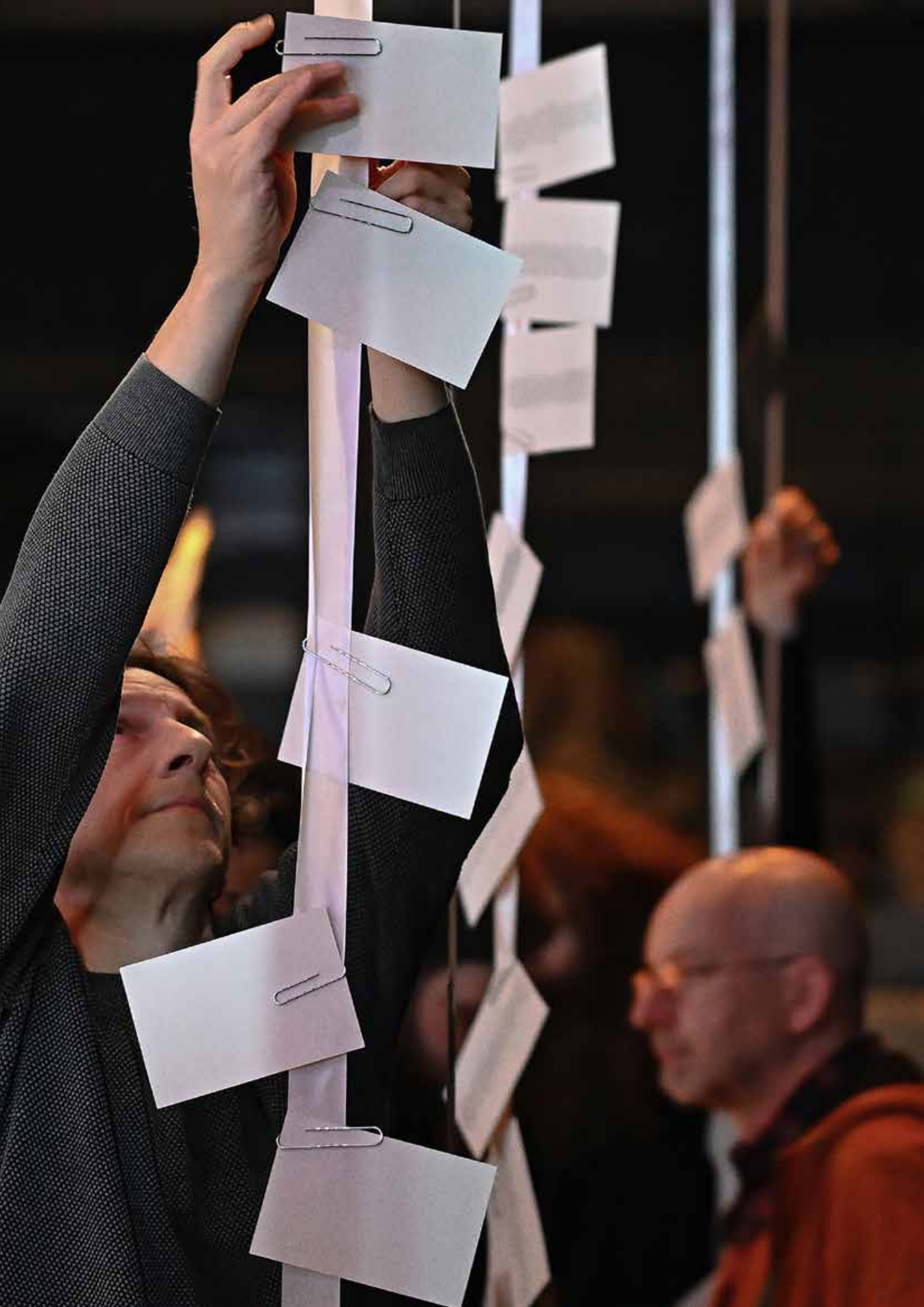

In 2024, Post Bellum sought to register a network of sites with a relationship to freedom of information and freedom of access. We have filmed witnesses to these sites. They were journalists, radio workers and dissidents.

Post Bellum continues to focus on the traditional themes long associated with the Memory of Nations collection. This year marks 80 years since the Second World War, and it is unfortunately becoming increasingly difficult to find witnesses to share their stories, especially regarding local events that would otherwise remain forgotten. Despite this, we continue to document the stories of people whose memories relate to more recent issues, such as collectivisation, the invasion by Warsaw Pact troops in August 1968 and Normalisation.

We document historical narratives and look for ways to share them, especially with younger generations. Witnesses share their life stories with us in the hopes that their stories will be shared with the general public and not forgotten. We share their stories through our radio and television series called *Stories of the 20th Century*, articles in the online *Memory of Nations Magazine* and other media. In addition, we teach history through the *Memory of Nations* Institutes and publish books, comics and podcasts. Recently, we launched a new podcast, *Voices of Memory*, with Lucie Korcová, Mikuláš Kroupa and Adam Drda. Our goal is to share these important stories with as many people as possible.



MEMORY OF NATIONS INSTITUTES (IPN)

The Memory of Nations Institutes and their multimedia exhibitions have expanded to a new region in 2024. In addition to Brno, Olomouc, Pardubice and Prague, Memory of Nations opened a new, long-term audiovisual exhibition, *Breaking Points*, in Ostrava in November 2024. This exhibition, like *Silent Heroism* in Brno and Pardubice, or *Uncovered Stories of the 20th Century* in Olomouc, is based on the stories of witnesses from the Memory of Nations' database. The aim of these exhibits is to attract young visitors and interest them in the history of the 20th century.



The **Memory of Nations Institute in Brno** continued to operate and promote its interactive multimedia exhibition, Silent Heroism, which is its central project. By the end of the year, 3,172 visitors, including 1,872 pupils and students, visited the exhibition. In addition to the exhibition, the institute organises a number of cultural events: screenings, talks, dance halls, debates and popular historical guided walks through Brno.

The **Memory of Nations Institute in Olomouc** is housed in a unique building: a former civil protection shelter. In this building, an audiovisual exhibition titled, Uncovered Stories of the 20th Century, is open to schools and the public, and reveals the dramatic fates of the war and communism survivors from the Olomouc Region. During 2024, 1,434 people visited this exhibition. The Institute has also begun to work on a new virtual game which will be launched in early 2025.

The **Memory of Nations Institute in Pardubice** has been an integral part of the cultural life of the city since 2022. This is not only thanks to the permanent interactive exhibition, Silent Heroism, which was visited by over 4,000 people during the year, but also thanks to regular Monday events (these events are held every Monday). In 2024, thirty-nine talks, lectures, and screenings were held on a regular basis and attended by over 1,500 visitors. Additionally, thirty-nine school classes passed through the Education Centre, which is part of this Memory of Nations Institute.

The **Memory of Nations Institute in Ostrava** was opened in November 2024 in the heart of the Lower Vítkovice area in the underground premises of the Futureum complex. It houses an interactive exhibition called Breaking Points, which presents key events of 20th century history through the stories of witnesses from the Moravian-Silesian Region. At the Ostrava Institute, people can also watch a documentary film about the Czech-Polish border and its history. The exhibition is open to the public and students of primary and secondary schools. Futureum offers exhibition and lecture spaces, where Memory of Nations will hold debates with screenings and workshops under the auspices of the Institute.



MEMORY OF NATIONS AWARDS

The fifteenth annual Memory of Nations Awards was held on 17 November 2024 at the National Theatre. We awarded five personalities from the Czech Republic, Slovakia and Ukraine for their courage and fight for freedom. The evening was hosted by Daniela Brzobohatá and Michael Szatmary, with music performances by the Ježkovy stopy Orchestra and the Memory of Nations Orchestra. Among the guests were President Petr Pavel and his wife, high representatives of the state, and our esteemed supporters.



MEMORY OF NATIONS INSTITUTE IN GREAT STRAHOV STADIUM, PRAGUE

Strahov Stadium contains a rich history and unique atmosphere, which is why it became the base of the Memory of Nations Institute in Prague. Between May and September 2024, dozens of cultural events were held there. Visitors especially enjoyed guided tours of the stadium and discussions on the use of drones in contemporary conflicts. Additionally, people could play a virtual game, Frost, at Strahov, visit the Memory Maze or explore the virtual gallery of life stories.



MEMORY OF NATIONS MAGAZINE

On 1 September 2024, we launched a new Memory of Nations website. Thanks to a modern design and better layout, we were able to enhance the appeal of our magazine, offering a more comfortable user experience. At the same time, we established a separate investigative editorial office, which focuses on select social issues, like violence against women during the communist regime. Readers especially enjoyed texts with war themes, stories with an overlap into the social reality of Czechoslovakia, the life stories of athletes, and articles reflecting Post Bellum's international activities.

Post Bellum Exhibitions

- The exhibition, **Read My Pins**, showed how Madeleine Albright used pins to express her views on diplomacy. It was opened by the U.S. Ambassador in Pardubice on the 25th anniversary of the Czech Republic's accession to NATO. The travelling exhibition was created in cooperation with the U.S. Embassy Prague.
- The permanent exhibition, **Memory of the Cuban Nation**, was on display in the south stand of Strahov Stadium and presented the stories of dissidents and human rights activists who have fought for freedom for the last 65 years. The exhibition was part of the activities of the Memory of Nations Institute in Prague.
- The exhibition, **Third time's the Harm**, brought together the stories of resistance fighters, dissidents, and their families who resisted the communist regime. It mapped the anti-communist resistance in the Hradec Králové Region.
- The Memory of Nations Institute in Brno hosted the exhibition **Once Upon a Time at Na Chmelnici**, commemorating the legendary Prague Junior Club Na Chmelnici, which was the centre of the so-called "second culture" under the previous regime. The exhibition, consisting of photographs, posters and artifacts, took visitors back to a time when Chmelnice shaped the artistic and general human orientation of two generations of young people.
- **Stories of North Bohemia – Turning Points of the 20th Century** presented personalities linked by landscape, people and modern history of this territory. The exhibition has been touring North Bohemia for the second year.
- The international exhibition **Kramatorsk, City on the Front Line – Voices of Ukrainian Women** was designed in cooperation with Post Bellum Ukraine and supported by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Czech Republic within the framework of the Transformation Cooperation Programme and Czech Foreign Development, Humanitarian and Transformation Cooperation Czech Aid. It presented the stories of women who have shaped history during the war in Ukraine. It took place in Prague and Bratislava.
- Audiovisual exposition **Breaking Points: The Heritage of Memory of the Moravian-Silesian Region**, under the auspices of the Memory of Nations Institute in Ostrava, presents the 20th century history of the region through the authentic stories of witnesses, which include political prisoners, war veterans, a Jewish girl, and courageous women from the resistance. The exhibition also traces the mining stories and problems of the inhabitants of the Těšín Region.
- The exhibition **Memory of the Border** captured the fate of people living on the Czech-German border. The exhibition was presented for the first time as part of the echoes of the Finále Plzeň Festival at the Filmové Kašperské Hory event.
- The Memory of Nations in East Bohemia offered an exhibition titled **Five Years of Fears** which presented the stories of witnesses from the Pardubice Region whose fates were affected by the communist coup in February 1948 and the subsequent terror. The exhibition showed how the totalitarian regime eliminated and intimidated opponents and confiscated their property.

Documentary projects produced by Post Bellum

BETWEEN THE DITCHES AND RAMPARTS

During the war, Terezín became a giant ghetto where Jews were concentrated not only from the Czech lands, but also from much of Europe. They inhabited every room, attic and cellar. Over 35,000 of them died in the ghetto. There is no other place in Czech territory so closely linked to the Holocaust. The locals would prefer to forget the grim history of their town, for it was “only four years”. But, even though the memory of the former ghetto is fading, revival of the town is yet to occur.

BEACON KAREL HUBÁČEK

In 2024, Post Bellum produced a documentary commemorating the 100th anniversary of the birth of Karel Hubáček. When the wave of Soviet occupiers washed away the hope of turning Czechoslovakia into a freer state, the question for many young people became how to continue living in a normalizing society. At that time, architect Karel Hubáček from Liberec became a beacon of hope who paved the path for dozens of young architects in the dark sea of normalization.

TO KILL A LIZARD – AIR POLLUTION DISASTER IN THE KRKONOŠE AND JIZERA MOUNTAINS IN THE 1970S AND 1980S

These were two documentaries about the ecological disaster of the forests in northern Bohemia. They bring unique perspectives and testimonies of witnesses and experts who were present in the affected area at the time, and document the consequences of these events for present and future generations.

BREAKING THE DAM

Prague was not the only place where courageous people decided to oppose the communist regime in the autumn of 1989 and actively participate in the revolution. The documentary film Breaking the Dam portrays the atmosphere of the 1980s in the testimonies of witnesses from Mariánské Lázně, Cheb, Sokolov and Karlovy Vary.

THE FINAL LANDING OF BOEING B 17G/004

A film documentary describing the events of October 1944 near the town of Napajedla where an American bomber landed and two airmen were murdered. The documentary was produced by the Memory of Nations Central Moravia with the contribution of the Napajedla Museum, the Napajedla Culture Club and the town of Napajedla.

As in previous years, projects connected to the Help for Ukraine with Memory of Nations fundraising campaign once again attracted media attention in 2024. Specifically, it was the Together for Ukraine project, which organized a rally in cooperation with other non-profit organizations to commemorate two years since the beginning of the war. The Run for Memory of Nations campaign was also very successful. Our most viewed post of 2024 was a video posted on 1 June reaching 522,755 viewers. It recalled an event that changed the lives of many Czechoslovak citizens 71 years ago – the 1953 monetary reform. The story of Maria Fifková, mentioned in the video, illustrated the harsh effects of this reform. Her family, living in poor conditions with her grandparents, began to build their own house. But their hopes for a better future were dashed when they lost almost all their savings in a single day.

In 2024, we again embraced the principles of intergenerational learning in the educational activities of the Memory of Nations and looked for ways to use them effectively in the school and out-of-school environment. Our core activities continued to grow and develop – whether it was Stories of Our Neighbours, Educational programmes, School Network, or Theatre projects. We maintained close cooperation with educators across the Czech Republic and expanded our range of experiential workshops and methodological materials, covering topics such as the end of World War II and the Czech Republic's accession to NATO. Our activities also crossed the borders of the Czech Republic to strengthen international cooperation. We continue to support Ukrainian students and help them to adapt to the Czech education system.

STORIES OF OUR NEIGHBOURS

A months-long project for primary school seniors and grammar school students was once again a key activity of the Memory of Nations Education Department. More than 4,300 children participated in this initiative. The documentary teams, working with teachers and experts from Post Bellum, were tasked with interviewing witnesses, filming their memories, digitising historical photographs, researching archives and eventually processing the results into radio, television or written report, comic or animation. They then presented the story of their witness to the public.



EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES

In 2024, we organized 420 experiential workshops, cinema stories and tutoring workshops for more than 10,000 pupils across the Czech Republic. The offer of 32 programmes was expanded by a new reading workshop called *At the End of the War*, which deals with the story of a German boy living in Postoloprty in the Ústí nad Labem Region, his memories of the end of the war, and the subsequent displacement of the Germans.

In autumn, together with the organization *Díky, že můžem* (Thanks that we can) we once again participated in the project *Velvet in Schools*, which helps primary and secondary schools across the Czech Republic to commemorate the anniversary of 17 November.

MEMORY OF NATIONS THEATRE

During the summer and winter semesters, 176 young people and 10 witnesses participated in the Memory of Nations Theatre studios. In the following summer and autumn semester, intergenerational workshops brought another 63 young participants and 5 witnesses into creative collaboration.

International cooperation has produced inspiring projects. With the German ensemble *Das Letzte Kleinod*, we staged the performance *Over the Fence*. In cooperation with the Danish *Norpol Theatre*, we created the production *I Trust You*. Together with the Czech ensemble *Krajina Přílivu* we prepared the theatre project *Preacher: Přemysl Pitter*.

Our long-term partnership with the Dutch Theatre *Na de Dam* continued in the project *Memory is Us*, which commemorates the victims of the Holocaust. This year it included the production called *Happiness*.



MEMORY OF NATIONS SCHOOL NETWORK

During the year 2024, twenty-three new schools registered to participate in the educational projects of the Memory of Nations School. We organized a series of seminars and excursions for the pre-existing teacher communities of the School Network, who meet regularly to learn and share best practices. These excursions took place in Prague, Brno and the Jihlava, Karlovy Vary, Kolín, Olomouc and Těšín Regions.



MEMORY OF NATIONS ADAPTATION CENTRE

Memory of Nations Education also helps with the adaptation and education of Ukrainian students aged 14 to 18, who were forced to leave their homes because of the war, and failed to enrol in Czech school. Since September 2024, the Adaptation Centre has cooperated with the Memory of Nations Grammar School on its third preparatory classes, which aim to prepare Ukrainian children for successful integration into the Czech education system. This is a year-long programme that runs until June 2025. In spring 2024, students successfully completed their second preparatory classes, and most are now studying at Czech secondary schools or universities while others are actively involved in the labour market. In the summer of 2025, the Adaptation Centre also organised a summer camp in the Jizera Mountains. In 2024, there were 111 young people who participated in the above-mentioned programmes.



INTERNATIONAL PROJECT MEMORY OF NATIONS: NATO ACCEPTANCE WITNESSES

Thanks to the financial support of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization we were able to create a new educational program, The Czech Path to NATO. It consists of a commemorative video documentary and methodological material that is ready for immediate use in teaching, as it is available to teachers on our website for free. Additionally, we organised a public debate at the Scout Institute, 6 seminars for teachers, and 30 workshops for young people.

THIS YEAR WE HAVE OPENED A RELIEF FUND AND WERE ABLE TO SUPPORT SEVEN WITNESSES WITH A TOTAL OF CZK 115,960.

In 2024, the Memory of Nations Help Hub continued to actively support the elderly by providing free counselling and professional social assistance. Our staff helps seniors in difficult life situations and increases the awareness and competence of seniors and their loved ones. This year we have expanded our activities to the Pardubice and Olomouc Regions. The Memory of Nations Help Hub now operates in five regional branches: in Prague, Pilsen, Liberec, Pardubice and Olomouc. Our social workers also travel to other regions. In the past year, we made 3,260 phone calls to witnesses, 319 personal visits (of which 119 were repeated),

976 congratulations on life anniversaries, and we helped 176 witnesses affected during the floods. We also assisted individuals with finding care, getting transportation to medical appointments and community involvement. We also advised on benefit applications, claiming rights and entitlements. We have also organised several gatherings. A big thank you also goes to our 19 volunteers who regularly visit the elderly and help to alleviate their loneliness. This year we have opened a Relief Fund and were able to support seven witnesses with a total of CZK 115,960.



HELP FOR UKRAINE

In the past year, we have also helped Ukrainian frontline troops with material support, with most of our focus being on saving human lives. In cooperation with the Donio portal, we raised funds from donors to equip two field hospitals with X-rays, blood warmers, cardio pumps, lung ventilators, sterilizers and ground drones for evacuating the wounded.

During November and December 2024, we delivered 107 generators, most of which went directly to frontline troops. We continue to deliver ambulances, evacuation vans, tourniquets to stop bleeding, first aid kits and other medical supplies to Ukraine.

Thanks to the Help for Ukraine with Memory of Nations fundraising, we have delivered aid worth more than CZK 560 million over three years.

In 2024 it was specifically:

- 100 lung ventilators
- 24 frontline ambulances and evacuation vehicles
- 200 adjustable beds
- medical supplies and equipment for field hospitals worth CZK 38 million
- 130 generators

- we focused on the exhibition Under the auspices of the Memory of Nations Institute in Ostrava and recorded 45 witnesses in the Ostrava studio
- we organized an exhibition on the 80th anniversary of the bombing of Ostrava, including an opening ceremony and commemoration act
- in cooperation with ČT Ostrava, we presented 10 witnesses from the region in a regional newscast
- the educational exhibition Memory of Nations in the Moravian-Silesian Region travelled around Ostrava-Centre, Vítkovice, Michálkovice, Rychvald, Vratimov, Brušperk, Třinec, Kunčice p. Ondřejníkem, etc.
- in cooperation with Jagello 2000, the Ministry of Defence of the Czech Republic and the Czechoslovak Legionary Society, we took part in several commemorative acts and prepared more than 12 debates with witnesses and documentary filmmakers
- debates for senior centres in Havířov, Poruba and Karviná were held continuously
- we organized a public collection for the War Veterans Day, held debates and created symbolic poppy fields in several towns
- in cooperation with volunteers, we organized the Run for Memory of Nations in Ostrava, which was attended by almost 250 runners

- in 2024 we continued to operate and promote our interactive multimedia exhibition Silent Heroism, which is the central project of the Memory of Nations Institute Brno
- by the end of the year, the exhibition 3,172 visitors, including 1,872 school pupils and students visited the exhibit
- 70 schools from Brno and the South Moravian Region participated in the Stories of Our Neighbours project
- from January to June, the theatre studio for children and young people aged 10 to 15 continued its activities; in June, the Memory of Nations Institute staged a performance of Head, Shoulders, Emigration for the public; since September 2024, the theatre studio has been operating in cooperation with the Micro-teatro for children aged 12 to 16
- we recorded 53 witnesses, with the average age being 82.5 years and the oldest being 98 years old
- we regularly held lectures and debates with experts, and other cultural events in the premises of the Memory of Nations Institute in Brno (a total of 99 events with 4,181 visitors); the total number of participants in these programmes and exhibitions was 7,353

International cooperation

Together, we strive to make the stories of witnesses of injustice known to the general public, even beyond our country's borders. The international section of the archive contains thousands of testimonies from more than 35 countries. In 2024, we continued to record important testimonies from abroad and aided countries where totalitarian regimes continue to rule in the 21st century.

GUARDIANS OF MEMORY

In the challenging conditions of the third year of the full-scale Russian invasion of Ukraine in 2024, we recorded 26 testimonies from women in Kramatorsk, Donetsk Region. Based on their stories, we organized an international exhibition in the Czech Republic and Slovakia, and a cinema story that, together with debates, opened up a space for discussion about women's rights and the role of women in times of crisis.



MEMORY AND CONSCIENCE OF NATIONS

Thanks to the support of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Czech Republic, we continue with our international project documenting the lives of human rights activists and political prisoners around the world. In 2024, we recorded stories from Egypt, Iran, Vietnam, Burma, Russia, Belarus and Azerbaijan.



MEMORY OF THE CUBAN NATION

Thanks to the support of the Czech Ministry of Foreign Affairs' Transition programme, we recorded 15 new testimonies of Cuban dissidents in 2024, expanding the world's largest Cuban online archive to 241 published witnesses.



EXPULSION OF GERMANS FROM CZECHOSLOVAKIA – FROM MEMORIES TO RECONCILIATION

For several past years we have recorded and published over 80 testimonies of German witnesses expelled from Czechoslovakia. This project, supported by the Czech Ministry of Foreign Affairs, culminated this year in the form of a film and an educational methodology for schools.



SOUTH CAUCASIAN AND VISEGRAD COUNTRIES

Thanks to the support of the International Visegrad Fund, we published 20 testimonies of Armenian and Georgian dissidents, or victims of totalitarian regimes, from these two Caucasian countries. Both filming sessions resulted in educational films that were screened in the participating countries.



FOREIGN PERSPECTIVES

The Foreign Perspectives project documents the memory of Czech historical milestones through the lens of foreigners, and their country of origin, who have temporarily, or permanently, lived in Czechoslovakia or the Czech Republic. The main focus is on the period of totalitarianism and the transition to democracy.

Other projects

- we have entered into an agreement with the owner of TV2, Viktor Muchnik, and have accepted into the Memory of Nations archive 600 unique testimonies of Russians, Belarusians and Ukrainians who gave interviews for the independent TV2
- we recorded 16 interviews with expatriate politicians and human rights activists from Belarus, refugees from Ukraine and oppositionists from Russia; these valuable recordings outline the ethical, legal and regulatory issues facing the countries of the Belovezha Accords
- we organized Russian-language tours of Strahov Stadium for our guests from Ukraine and Belarus

The Friends of Memory of Nations Club brings together people with an interest in history who actively support our activities. For our members we organize thematic walks, trips and meetings with witnesses. In 2024, we visited Rudolfov to commemorate the security forces' brutal attack against the participants in the 1974 concert of The Plastic People of the Universe. Another powerful moment was our trip to Auschwitz, where we not only toured exhibits, but also got in touch with survivor Eva Erben who shared her memories with us. We supported the Friends Club with an extensive campaign last year and were delighted to welcome many new members.



MEMORY OF NATIONS COLLEGIUM

The Memory of Nations Collegium is a loose association of friends and partners of Post Bellum. Its aim is to connect personalities of Czech public, social and business life who are not indifferent to the legacy of older generations. The members of the Memory of Nations Collegium are united by their shared respect for those who resisted the totalitarian regimes of the 20th century.

PUBLIC COLLECTION FOR WAR VETERANS DAY

More than 89,000 people contributed to the collection this year. Poppies could be purchased at almost 1,500 locations and over 1,700 volunteers, including schools and other organisations, took part in the street collection. In 11 cities across the Czech Republic, every virtual poppy purchased was turned into a real one and became part of the symbolic poppy field. Companies, shops, bookstores, cafes, florists, newsagents, and bakeries all had cash boxes placed in their branches or shops and were able to contribute to the collection. The money went to support the Memory of Nations Help Hub and the remaining funds were used to document further stories.



RUN FOR MEMORY OF NATIONS

4,087 runners took part in the 9th edition of the event, raising more than CZK 1.9 million for the activities of the Memory of Nations. Runners lined up at the start of the mass race at 13 locations across the Czech Republic, and two hundred people took their own route at home and abroad as part of the Run Anywhere! Seventy-one teams took part in the corporate challenge throughout the month, with teams and individuals tracking results on an online timing system, motivated to perform their best. Primary school pupils and teachers were also active over the 14 days, with a total of 48 teams entered in the school challenge.

HELP FOR UKRAINE WITH MEMORY OF NATIONS

In 2024, nearly 5,500 donors from the public and private sector participated in the fundraising for Ukraine. Through financial and in-kind donations, they supported Ukraine with over CZK 63 million, which is more than the previous year. The Czechs have thus shown that they stand behind the invaded country. We always delivered the purchased material aid to its destination as quickly as possible. On behalf of our partners in Ukraine, we would like to thank all donors for their help and solidarity.

In the area of grant fundraising, we closely monitored the grant programmes announced in 2024. From January to December, a total of 189 grant applications were submitted, from which we have received approximately CZK 41,350,000 in project funding as of this date, 31 March 2025. Traditionally, the largest providers of grant support have been municipalities, regions and ministries. Other projects have been supported by programmes of foreign foundations and international governmental and non-governmental organisations.

We greatly appreciate the support provided, which enables us to fulfil and further develop our activities in the field of documentation, education storytelling, and elsewhere. We are especially pleased that many institutions support our activities repeatedly and over the long term.

POST BELLUM PRODUCTION

Post Bellum Production, s. r. o., is a subsidiary organisation of Post Bellum, z. ú., and its main goal is to raise additional funds for the activities of the parent non-profit organization through regular commercial activities. These include, in particular, the Memory of Nations e-shop, commercial exhibitions, the production of commercial videos and the sale of advertising space.

In addition, Post Bellum Production, s.r.o. also includes part of the editorial department, namely the Memory of Nations Podcast: Dobrovský & Šídlo, subscriptions to the Memory of Nations Magazine and publishing activities.



MEMORY OF NATIONS E-SHOP

A new e-shop was launched in 2022. Since then, we have continuously developed it. The peak season is, of course, Christmas. For this occasion, we produced a limited edition of luxury pralines to showcase the many roles of the Memory of Nations. MEMORY OF NATIONS GRAMMAR SCHOOL

In September 2024, we were able to fully fill all four years of the Memory of Nations Grammar School thanks to the entry of the freshmen. The mission of the Grammar School is to encourage young people to explore the world, to enhance their ability, and confidence to follow their dreams. We share common values and projects with our founder. We are involved in Stories of Our Neighbours and filming witnesses. We have started the tradition of a Modern History Colloquium in Year 2 or a Class Work Symposium in Year 3.

Memory of Nations Grammar School and Post Bellum Production, s. r. o. are subsidiary organisations of Post Bellum, z.ú., and therefore their activities are not included in the financial report.

POST BELLUM UKRAINE

In 2024, Post Bellum Ukraine recorded 56 stories, published 50 testimonies and submitted 10 grant applications (independently and in cooperation with Post Bellum Czech Republic). Four of them were supported and will be implemented in 2025.

Post Bellum Ukraine presented the first two educational films in 2024. They were screened with discussions in the Czech Republic and Ukraine. Working across target groups using different formats (film, podcast, exhibition, special media project) was crucial for us in 2024. Thanks to this experience, we now have a much better understanding of how to use oral history to renew and establish public dialogue in Ukraine, and we will continue in this direction. The list of our partners and colleagues continues to grow: PB UA now has partner teams in Kramatorsk and Ivano-Frankivsk. In early 2024, the Post Bellum Ukraine documentary team embarked on an expedition to Bessarabia, the most ethnically diverse region of the Odessa region, where journalists are usually not allowed. We recorded stories about Ukraine's ethnic minorities there.

As in 2022/23, we organized the television broadcast of the Memory of Nations Awards and invited Ukrainian laureate, dissident and civil activist Olga Heiko to Prague for the gala evening on 17 November. We also helped the army and field doctors who made it possible for us to work in Ukraine.

We presented Post Bellum Ukraine's activities in seven Ukrainian regions in 2024. During the year we produced 88 media outputs, including a special project on active women from Kramatorsk and portraits of displaced artists from Ivano-Frankivsk. The number of supporters on our social media platforms have also grown – the Facebook page currently has over 3,200 followers, and the Instagram page around 12,500.

POST BELLUM SLOVAKIA

In 2024, we documented a total of 136 stories for our Slovak database, which we published on our website and in our Magazine. In addition, we organised 267 educational workshops in which approximately 8,010 pupils and students attended. In December, we presented the Stories of Our Neighbours project in Prešov in cooperation with the United Evangelical School, and in Bratislava we staged the Memory of Nations Theatre.

As part of our educational activities, we have added 40 new worksheets for primary and secondary schools and 20 methodologies for teachers to the Memory of Nations Puzzle website. We also organized the 5th annual memorial Footsteps of Hidden Children, or Run for Memory of Nations, in Bratislava. We presented our activities to the general public through travelling exhibitions. In total, we organized 7 talks within the session Freedom is not a happy end! and 35 new episodes of the podcast Stories of the 20th Century.

CHANGES TO THE FOUNDING LEGAL ACT AND THE INSTITUTE'S BODIES IN 2024

There were no changes to the founding legal act (founding charter) and no changes to the composition of the institute's bodies in 2024.
